

The feminist-surrealist art of Penny Slinger

Blum & Poe gallery was set up in 2003 by its co-owners Tim Blum and Jeff Poe. It annually stages important exhibitions showcasing a fine choice of renowned local and international contemporary artists within its premises, located in the art district of Culver City in western Los Angeles County. Until 24 May, the gallery will devote a comprehensive display to the British surrealist artist Penny Slinger (born 1947), who started her career as one of just a few celebrated female artists in the art scene of late 1960s "Swinging London".



Visitors to the show, Slinger's first solo exhibition in Los Angeles, will experience a selection of powerful photographic collages from various creative periods, as well as film footage that has not been publically seen as yet. Immerse yourself into the artist's symbolheavy works. Slinger deals with the topics of feminism, eroticism and mysticism while examining views on women and their selfperception, merging them with references to ancient Egyptian imagery and the occult.
