

Penelope Slinger b. 1947, London

Penelope Slinger has worked as an artist, filmmaker, actress, art director and author. She was an active member of the Holocaust Theatre Company in 1971 before acting in and art directing Jane Arden's film The Other Side of the Underneath (1973). Her publications include The Path of the Mystic Lover - Baul Songs of Passion and Ecstasy (with Bhaskar Bhattacharya, 1993); Mountain Ecstasy and Sexual Secrets (1978); The Book of Matan (1977); The Secret Dakini Oracle, a deck of cards for divination (all with Nik Douglas, 1977–79); Publication of An Exorcism (1977) and 50% - The Visible Woman (1971). Her artwork has been exhibited in Angels of Anarchy, Manchester Art Gallery (2009); The Dark Monarch, Towner, Eastbourne (2010) and Tate St Ives (2009); Surrealism & Company In This Decade, Camden Arts Centre, London (1978); the 12th Bienal de São Paulo (1973) and Young and Fantastic, Institute of Contemporary Arts, London (1969). She lives and works in Boulder Creek, California.

Art and the Feminist Revolution, MoMA PS1, New York (2007); Los Angeles, 1955-1985, Centre Georges Pompidou, Paris (2006); Made in California: Art, Image and Identity, 1900-2000, Los Angeles County Museum of Art (2000) and Out of Actions: Between Performance & the Object, 1947-1979, Museum of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles; MAK, Austrian Museum of Applied Arts, Vienna and Museu d'Art Contemporani de Barcelona (1998). She lives and works in Los Angeles.

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
